Sardinia is a large island in the centre of the western Mediterranean. Its 1.850 km of coastline alternates long stretches of sandy beaches with rocky headlands and sheer cliffs walls. The interior consists mainly of hills and mountains of volcanic origin, crossed by wide swathes of plain. Its combined landforms create a variety of distinct landscapes which have influenced the island's history, culture and economy.

The countryside landscape is punctuated with Nuraghi (typical prehistoric stone towers) and monuments which bear witness to the island's rich history. Each area of the island deserves to be explored and appreciated for its unique and unspoilt nature and its folk and gastronomic traditions.
